Historical Geography of the Bible I: Israel

May 15 - June 4, 2017

This course is designed to familiarize students with the physical stage on which most Biblical events transpired. The country is examined on a regional basis, observing how the character of each region, and the routes which passed through it, influenced the history of the area. Attention will be given to the imagery used by the Biblical writers in connection with each region. Issues in historical geography, natural history, archaeology, ancient texts, and anthropological models are explored.

The course is offered on the graduate level and includes lectures and thirteen days of field trips. Qualified undergraduates may participate.

Credits: 3 graduate credits.



Introduction to the Geographical, Historical and Cultural Backgrounds of the Bible

June 11 - 25, 2017

This program is designed for serious students of the Bible who wish to explore the land of the Bible in-depth but do not desire to earn academic credit or are unable to participate in the fuller, three-week program. Twelve days of field trips provide an excellent forum for studying "in-the-field," as the students journey "from Dan to Beersheba."
