FALL 2020 COURSE OFFERINGS

1004 Intertestamental Literature: Qumran, Apocrypha, and Pseudepigrapha **3 credits**
The purpose of this course is to survey of the literature of the Dead Sea sectarians and the Apocrypha and Pseudepigrapha of the Old Testament. Familiarity with the QAP corpus, its character and contents will be required, and stress will be placed on methodological issues and their implications for the study of Second Temple Period Judaism. The literature will be studied in its historical context, from the preceding Hebrew Bible, contemporary Judaism and paganism and an incipient Christianity. **Instructor: V. Hillel, Ph.D. Wednesdays, 15:00-17:30.**

1005 Synoptic Gospels **3 credits**
The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke are introduced and examined. The Gospels and the life of Jesus will be presented against the background of their natural, religious, and political environment. Special emphasis is given to the relationship between the three earliest Gospels and their Jewish sources. **Instructor: C. Pfann, M.A., Ph.D. Cand. Wednesdays, 9:00-11:30.**

1041 Early Church History and Theology: Patristics **3 credits**
The course concentrates on the development of the Christian church from its inception as local assemblies of Christians at the end of the Second Temple period to its roles as a state church in the Roman Empire and as minorities in Persia, up to the fifth century CE. Three areas are of primary interest: (1) Regional expansions of the church in and outside the Roman Empire, such as in North Africa, Syria and Persia; (2) Doctrinal discussions (a) before and (b) after the first ecumenical council (325 CE). Period (a) includes encounters with, e.g., the Imperial Cult, Gnosis and Judaism; period (b) focuses on such issues as creeds and monasticism. (3) Early Christian literature, including martyrologies, homilies and church histories. **Instructor: J. Black, M.A., Ph.D. Cand., Mondays, 12:30-15:00.**

1054 Jewish Practice **3 credits**
This course will examine the daily, weekly, monthly and annual celebrations and ritual practices of Jewish life. Special attention will be given to the formation of Jewish Festivals from Bible to Rabbinic culture, including some elements of liturgical developments as well. **Instructor: R. Kiperwasser, Ph.D. Thursdays, 9:00-11:30.**

1060 Introduction to Greek **3 credits**
Part one of a two semester course. This course is an introduction to the Koine Greek of the Septuagint, inscriptions, Philo, Josephus, the New Testament, and early Christian literature, **Instructor: M. Stover, M.A. Monday, 15:30-17:00, and Thursday, 15:00-16:30.**

1086 Land, Nature, and Society in Biblical Times I **3 credits**
Part one of a two-semester course focusing on studies of ecology (including the interrelation of geology, soils, and climate to form floral and faunal economies); physical geography; cultural geography (especially family, agrarian, nomadic, and maritime societies); the ancient city (related to home, village, and town); and the cycle of the year (including seasons, the celestial clock, and the religious festivals); sacred space and temple; and the ancient city. *Course includes field trip fee.* **Instructors: W. Ondricek, M.A., Ph.D. Cand. Tuesday, 12:30-15:00.**

1090 Practicum for M.Th.S. Students
The M.Th.S. requires 12 credit hours (180 physical hours) of cross-cultural, service-orientated experience in lieu of an M.A. thesis. A student must submit the proposed practicum to the Academic Affairs Committee including

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the details of the position, requirements, location, and supervisor. Upon completion of the program, an evaluation from the supervisor and a personal evaluation from the student are required every semester until the requirement is fulfilled.

1094 Graduate Seminar: Unlocking the Distant and Not-so-Distant Past **3 credits**

An extraordinary series of lectures given by leading scholars of the Jerusalem and international community who speak on their specific areas of expertise and current research and methodological interests, particularly pertaining to Biblical and archaeological studies and contemporary Israel. Attendance is required for second-year M.A., M.Div., Ph.D., and all Continuing Registration students. **Moderator: C. Pfann, Ph.D., Cand. Biweekly. Day and time TBA.**

1099 M.A. Thesis Development and Writing Supervision **3 credits**

The M.A. thesis is an important demonstration of a student's critical research and academic skills. The thesis is written on a research question which must be approved by the thesis advisor and Academic Committee. Guidance in formulating the thesis proposal and writing the thesis is given in this seminar. **Attendance is required of all masters students who are writing theses. Moderator: S. Pfann. Biweekly.**

2020 Research Skills and Methodologies **3 credits**

This course is designed to equip the student with the basic skills of defining a research topic, critical analysis of sources, and academic writing, including stylistic and technical aspects of writing papers. 2090-K Master of Divinity Practicum

The M.Div. requires 6 credit hours (90 physical hours) of ministry experience in a church or para-church context. The student must submit a proposal for the field practicum to the Academic Affairs Committee. The proposal should include the details of the position, nature of service, requirements, location, and supervisor. Upon completion of the program, an evaluation from the supervisor and a personal report from the student are required.

2091-K Master of Divinity Seminar **3 credits**

An extraordinary series of lectures given by leading scholars of the Jerusalem and international community who speak on their specific areas of expertise and current research and methodological interests, particularly pertaining to Biblical and archaeological studies and contemporary Israel. 3001 Doctoral Seminar **3 credits**

3003 Doctoral Seminar: Research and Writing of Dissertations Supervision **3 credits**

Supervision and guidance for research students to discuss research and methodology issues and a venue for presentation and review of their current research projects. Questions pertaining to formulation of research questions and dissertation proposal writing will be addressed. **Attendance is of required of all doctoral students. Moderator: S. Pfann, Ph.D. Biweekly. Fridays, 9:00-11:30.**

1040-K 구약과 고대근동의 역사 **History of the Old Testament and the Ancient Near East** **3 credits**
구약성경은 이스라엘과 고대근동의 시간적 공간적 배경에서 기록되었다. 구약성경의 역사는 고대근동의 역사와 맞물려 있다. 본 과목에서는 구약성경의 역사를 잘 이해하기 위해서 구약성경의 역사와 관련된 고대근동의 역사를 구약성경과 함께 살펴보고자 한다. 강사: 정연호, Ph.D. Inst.: J. Chung, Ph.D.

2020-K 논문수업 (Term Paper and Thesis Writing) **3 credits**
본 과정은 학기의 텀 페이지, 리서치 페이지, 논문 쓰기에 관한 과정이다. 논문의 주제잡기, 논문의 자료 모으기와 정리, 쓰기(각주, 참고문헌 달기)에 이르기까지 논문의 모든 과정을 다룬다. 이 과정은 최소한 3 학기를 연속으로 수강하는 것을 원칙으로 하며, 최종적으로 지도교수가 정해지면 그 해당 지도교수에게로 연결되어 논문을 마무리하는 것을 목표로 한다. 강사: 정연호, Ph.D. Inst.: J. Chung, Ph.D. **Mondays, 9:30-12:00.**

2045-K The Book of Hosea **3 credits**
주전 8-7세기 예언자를 고전 예언자 혹은 문서 예언자라고 부른다. 전기 예언서(여호수아-왕하)와 관련해서 후기 예언서라고도 불린다. 본 과목에서는 후기 예언서를 예언현상의 기원, 고대 근동과 이스라엘에서의 예언자들의 역할, 예언 신탁의 과정, 예언서의 형성, 예언서 연구 방법론 등을 전체적으로 조망하면서 호세아서에 집중하고자 한다. 호세아서는 주전 8세기 중엽의 예언자 호세아가 북이스라엘의 타락을 종교적, 영적 관점에서 진단하면서 그가 받은 하나님의 심판과 회복에 관한 예언을 담은 책이다. 호세아서의 연구는 크게 두 가지 측면에서 의의를 갖는다: (1) 8세기 중엽의 북이스라엘이 극심한 신앙적 타락으로 멸망의 운명에 직면하고 있었지만 경제, 군사적 변영에 취해서 영적 무지와 무감각에 빠져 있던 종교적 현실을 비판하며 회개를 촉구하고 있다는 점에서 21세기에 새롭게 들려지는 하나님의 말씀이다; (2) 율법적 공의와 윤리가 강조되던 구약 시대에 신약의 사랑의 복음과 가장 유사한 메시지를 주고 있을 뿐 아니라, 미드라쉬적 해석을 통해 랍비 유대교와 초기 기독교의 교리 형성에 중요한 공헌을 한 책이다. 본 과목은 다음의 4개의 측면에 초점을 두고 강의가 진행된다: (1) 본문의 통일성과 진정성 - 현재의 본문에 대한 주요한 비평적 관점들을 고찰하되, 본문의 통일성과 진정성을 지지하는 정경적 접근에서 본문을 살필 것이다; (2) 히브리어 원문의 분석에 기초한 본문의 의도와 신학적 의미를 찾을 것이다; (3) 신약 성경의 본문과 관련하여 미드라쉬적 해석을 고찰할 것이다; (4) 주요한 종교적 타락 현상들과 관련된 학문적 논쟁들 - 예컨대, 성적 풍요제, 바알 종교와 야웨이즘 등 - 을 다룬다. 2069-K 성결 법전 - 장세호 박사 **The Holiness Code** **3 credits**
성결법전은 모세오경을 구성하는 율법 묶음 중 하나를 구성한다. 성결 법전을 알기 위해서, 우리는 오경에 나오는 여러가지의 동일한 법들을 비교할 것이며, 또한 그 과정을 통해서 이 성결 법전은 어느 시대를 염두에 두고 있으며, 그 청중은 누구인지도 찾아 볼 수 있을 것이다. 제일 중요한 법들중 하나인 안식일법과 안식년, 희년(히, 요벨)을 연구할 것이며, 또한 유대교에 있어서 가장 중요하다고 할 수 있는 절기법 (Lev 23장과 Exod 12; 23:14-17; 34:21-24; Num 28-29; Deut 16)을 비교 조사할 것이다. 그리고, 성결 법전의 법 묶음이라 할 수 있는 레 17-26장에 등장하는 법들을 다른 법들에 언급되는 같은 법들과도 비교할 것이다. 이와 더불어, 사회적인 약자 계층인 게르에 대한 각 법들 (Lev 19:9-10, 33; 20:2; 22:18; 23:22; 24:16, etc)의 해결 방법과 그들의 제사 참여 문제 (Lev 17:8, 10, 13, cf. Lev 16:29), 땅의 회복 (Lev 25:13-28) 등도 아울러 함께 비교할 것이다. 이 수업을 통해 우리는 구약 시대 이스라엘의 법정신이 어떤 흐름으로 변화되고 발전되었는지를 살피게 될 것이며, 그와 더불어 어떤 시대적인 변화가 그들에게 있었는지도 살펴보게 될 것이다.

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2090-K 목회학석사(M. Div) 현장실습 (Practicum for M.Div. Students) 6 credits

목회학석사(M.Div) 학생들은 6 학점(90 시간)의 교회나 교회배경에서의 사역경험이 필요합니다. 학생은 현장실습을 위한 제 안서를 학술위원회에 제출해야 합니다. 제안서에는 사역에서의 포지션, 사역의 본질, 요구사항, 사역장소 및 감독자 등 세부 사항이 포함되어야 합니다. 현장실습을 완성하면 감독자의 평가서와 학생의 개인보고서를 제출해야 합니다.

2091-K 목회학석사 세미나: 먼 과거와 멀지 않은 과거를 풀다 (Master of Divinity Seminar) 3 credits

PREPARATION PROGRAM COURSES

2011 English Preparation Program Upper Intermediate Course 9 credits

A goal-based English language pre-intermediate course designed to prepare Preparation Program students to use speaking, listening, reading and writing skills independently and also for further academic studies at UHL. The course utilizes a structured curriculum centered on purposeful and realistic objectives and scenarios. Students also develop vocabulary and a solid understanding of English grammar. Students develop and practice their skills in structured learning sessions both within and outside of the classroom. **Instructor: C. Ramsey.**

2012 English Preparation Program Advanced Course 9 credits

A goal-based English language intermediate course designed to prepare Preparation Program students to use speaking, listening, reading and writing skills independently and also for further academic studies at UHL. The course utilizes a structured curriculum centered on purposeful and realistic objectives and scenarios. Students also develop vocabulary and a solid understanding of English grammar. SUMMER 2021 SHORT-TERM COURSES

1082 Historical Geography of Israel

This course is designed to familiarize students with the physical stage on which most Biblical events transpired. The country is examined on a regional basis, observing how the character of each region, and the routes which passed through it, influenced the history of the area. Attention will be given to the imagery used by the Biblical writers in connection with each region. Issues in historical geography, natural history, archaeology, ancient texts, and anthropological models are explored. Course is offered intensively over three weeks in May-June and includes thirteen days of field trips. *An additional field trip fee is charged.* **Instructor: G. Caessens, Ph.D.**

Dates: May 17 – June 6, 2021.

1083 Historical Geography of the Bible 2: Jordan

The same approach is taken as in Historical Geography of Israel. Regions visited include Ammon, Gilead, the Madaba Plateau, Moab and Edom. Many Biblical events transpired in this region where the tribes of Reuben, Gad and the half-tribe of Manasseh settled. Moses died in Transjordan and the judges and prophets, including Elijah, John the Baptist, Jesus and Paul all ministered in the area, which played a crucial role in international trade during Old and New Testament times. The course is offered intensively over two weeks in June and

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includes nine days of field trips. *An additional field trip fee is charged.* Instructor: G. Caessens, Ph.D. Dates: **June 7 – 21, 2021.**

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
